


Basel is alive and kicking – and a first address for the entire scale of enriching, entertaining and moving arts and culture.




Leonhard Ruethmueller | Contemporary Art

The show room by the market square unites city office and presentation room; with it's large window functioning as communication tool. Colour, light and video projections individually created for each exhibition and presented through the window, attract and immediately involve the public.

The recent years of recession throughout the art market did not influence or break the gallery's existence and spirit, and the presentation of renowned artists continued: Not Vital, Qin Yufen, Valery Koshlyakov, Kaeseberg, Oleg Kulik, Jürgen Möbius are only some of the prestigious artists who belong to the gallery's "regulars", underlining and confirming a progressive, innovative and successful course on the complex and vast market of contemporary art
